We are excited to announce that the Village of Tijeras and Bernalillo County are jointly applying for grant funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to expand broadband internet access in the East Mountains, and in particular south of I-40. In this environment of remote work and learning, reliable access to the internet is more important than ever.


One required component of the grant application is a survey of the community, including residents, businesses, and community facilities. The survey asks for some basic demographic information and includes several questions about residents' current internet connections.
