Seeing as the holiday comes just after the lifting of all COVID-19 related restrictions in New Mexico on July 1st, there is certainly a great deal to celebrate this year. While I know everyone is eager to celebrate this proud day in our country's history, it is important that we as a community do so safely. As a reminder, pursuant to Ordinance No. 165 <u>aerial</u> <u>fireworks are prohibited in the Village of Tijeras</u>. Violation of this ordinance is a petty misdemeanor and carries penalties of up to \$500 and 90 days imprisonment. This prohibition is designed to keep our residents and neighbors safe. The Village of Tijeras and the East Mountains in general are at extreme risk from fires, especially given how dry this year has been so far. We all know fireworks are a lot of fun, but a single mistake could mean the loss of someone's home or even their life.

I encourage you to explore opportunities for official fireworks displays being put on in other communities, such as in Albuquerque. I also ask that if you see anyone using fireworks in your neighborhood over Fourth of July Weekend, please notify the Village and the authorities. I hope you all have a safe and enjoyable Independence Day Weekend!

WELL NO. 3 PHASE 2 PROJECT


Last year, the Village of Tijeras drilled a new commercial well to ensure our community continues to have plenty of water for many years to come. We are excited to announce that this year the Village will complete Phase 2 of the project, bringing the new well online and connecting it to the rest of our system.

The Village went out to bid on this project in a sealed competitive process. The lowest responsive bidder was TLC Plumbing and Utility. Last week, Village staff met with representatives from TLC and the Village's engineering firm, Molzen and Corbin, for a preconstruction meeting.


Work is expected to begin on this project early next month. Construction will likely result in temporary water outages for certain water customers, particularly in the Primera Agua neighborhood. The project will also require roadwork on NM-333, but that portion of the project has been scheduled to have as little impact on the community as possible. CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT

The Village of Tijeras recently sent its 2020 Consumer Confidence Report out to all our water customers. This report, required by the New Mexico Environment Department, provides information to water customers on the quality of their drinking water.

As described in the report, the water provided by the Village meets all Environmental Protection Agency and state drinking water health standards. The source of the tap water in the Village of Tijeras is ground water. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Some of these minerals and substances are considered contaminants, and the presence of small amounts of certain contaminants in a water supply is quite normal. In all cases, the level of contaminants detected in Village water is well below the maximum thresholds set forward by regulatory agencies. In other words, Village water poses no known risk to the health of our customers.
