MEMORIAL DAY RECAP

After the performance of the National Anthem the Village welcomed two guest speakers: Merritt Hamilton Allen and Eddie Rael. Both speakers delivered fantastic recollections of how their lives were inspired by the actions of a Veteran. Merritt Hamilton Allen grew up in Silver City and was commissioned in the Navy through the NROTC program at University of Norte Dame in 1991. She retired medically from the Navy as a lieutenant in 1999. Eddie Rael retired from the United States Merchant Marine. You may also know him as the show host on 92.9 FM KDSK. He was a supporter of the initial development of the Tijeras Veterans Memorial. Felix Garcia and Michael Wismer, both former servants to the Village of Tijeras, placed the Memorial Wreath. Felix Garcia served in the US Army and achieved the rank of Sergeant. He also served the Village for over 45 years as both Mayor and Councilor. Michael Wismer achieved the rank of Major during his time in the US Air Force and worked for a time as Village Clerk. I would like to thank all these outstanding individuals for their time and their stories they shared this past weekend. Without them or staff events such as this would not be possible.









READY, SET, GO! FIRE ACTION PLAN

Fire Season is a year-round reality in many areas around New Mexico. During this time our County firefighters and residents need to be on heightened alert for the threat of wildfires. I wanted to touch base on some tips that were shared with Village Council and staff by Bernalillo County Fire Chief Greg Perez. Each year wildfires threaten to consume hundreds of homes in New Mexico. Studies have shown that as many as 80 percent of homes lost to wildfires could have been saved if their homeowners had followed a few simple fire-safe practices. Wildfire related deaths often occur when people wait too long to evacuate their homes. We should all follow the mantra of "Ready, Set, Go." The first step to being ready involves creating a family disaster plan. This plan should include emergency meeting locations and communication plans that include evacuation of large animals. Ensure your family has fire extinguishers, and know your main shut off controls for utilities. Second is Set. You must be prepared by monitoring fire and weather conditions. To see the latest in conditions visit: https://inciweb.nwcg.gov/. The NM Dept. of Homeland Security & Emergency Management recommends every family have 3 types of emergency kits assembled long before a wildfire emergency. Each kit should have a 3-day supply of water (one gallon per person per day) with non perishable food, first aid kit with sanitation supplies, flashlight, battery powered radio with extra batteries, extra sets of car keys, and credit cards with cash. Finally step 3 is Go! Now that we have our lists and bags it's time to act early and give our loved ones the best chance of surviving the fires. This also helps fire crews by keeping roads clear of congestion, enabling them to move much more freely and do their job in a safer environment. Although the Village of Tijeras is located a safe distance from active fires it's best to know these practices in case of a emergency or if you know of a loved one who may be at risk of these dangers. Restrooms are located inside Village Hall and you can access them by using the handicap accessible ramp on the west side of the building. Once inside the restrooms are down the hallway on your left!. Audio for the Park and View is transmitted directly to your car stereo. Be sure to tune into 92.5 FM to hear the film.
