NMML 66TH ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The New Mexico Municipal League held its 66th Annual Conference from August 29th through September 1st in Farmington. Grant Writer/Administrator Shaline Lopez attended on behalf of the Village to gain valuable information about issues related to local government. The following is a report from Shaline about her experience:

"The annual conference took place at the Farmington Civic Center, the area was spacious, with beautiful landscaping with a wonderful water feature in the central plaza.

Day one was divided among several subsection meetings in which I attended the Clerk's and Finance Officers Association. The meeting was hosted by Rebecca Martinez, Clerk for Rio Rancho. Discussion was held regarding the changes to the Inspection of Public Records Act and how it effects clerks around New Mexico.

Day two began with Mayor Duckett of Farmington welcoming all attendees to the town. Mayor Duckett and City Manager Rob Mayes presented the "Farmington Story". They detailed the expansion of economic development in Farmington and the town's goal to become a tourist hub. Aside from economic development, the team in Farmington met with residents to hear about their goals for the town. The creation of a strategic plan, divided across several departments of the town, helped focus projects to develop infrastructure and recreational facilities. Although the plan is still in progress, it is truly inspiring to see the work a community and a staff can achieve when on the same page.

The final session of the event was hosted by Shannon Norris-Parish, an NMSU professor, regarding changing our perspective on disagreement and keeping oneself open to learning and new opportunities. There were a lot of interesting conversations that and I really look forward to sharing the information with the staff and Governing Body."
