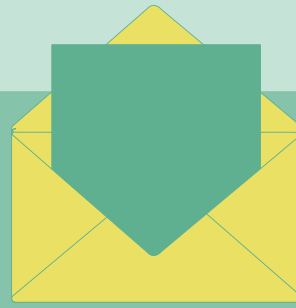

Fire Season is Here - Help Protect Our Community


As we continue through fire season, we encourage all residents to take steps to reduce wildfire risk around your homes and properties. Simple mitigation efforts can make a significant difference in protecting your family, neighbors, and our community.

Here are a few ways you can help:

- Remove dead trees, bush, leaves, and other dry vegetation from your property.
- Keep grass mowed and trim tree branches at least 6 to 10 feet from the ground.
- Clear leaves and pine needles from roofs, gutters, decks, and around your home.
- Move firewood, propane tanks, and other combustible materials at least 30 feet away from structures whenever possible.
- Create defensible space around your home by maintaining a clear area free of flammable materials.

Please remember to use extreme caution with outdoor equipment that may create sparks and always follow local fire restrictions or burn bans that may be in effect.

By working together and taking proactive steps, we can help reduce the risk of wildfire and keep the Village of Tijeras safe throughout the fire season.
